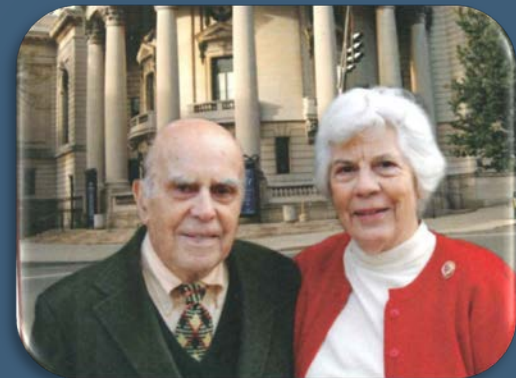
History and Donor



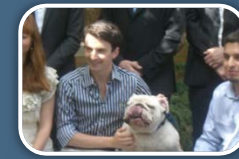
The program was established by Joseph Carrère Fox, Yale'38, in 1989 as a result of his deeply held belief in the

The goal of the fellowship



- To identify and support talented individuals who will be future leaders in their respective fields and will contribute to decisions affecting global policies and international relations.
- To encourage students, while pursuing academic research in another country, to immerse themselves in the local language and culture and develop lasting friendships with peers.

Program Description



Fox Fellowship supports 10 months of independent research in the following fields:

- International Relations
- Law
- Global Health
- Business and Finance
- Management
- Contemporary History
- Environmental Policy

Selection Criteria



Fox Fellows are selected on the basis of the following criteria:

- Quality of research proposal
- Strength of academic achievement
- Character and demonstrated leadership potential
- Demonstrated personal commitment to being a “citizen ambassador”
- Relevance of Yale university for their project

What the Fellowship Provides

- **Student status, which will provide:**
 - ✓ access to archives and library resources
 - ✓ opportunity to work with faculty and interact with other students and researchers in the field
 - ✓ opportunity to audit courses (not for credit)
 - ✓ gym membership
 - ✓ student discounts
- **Stipend to cover living expenses**
- **Housing**
- **Airfare**
- **Health Insurance**



Eligibility



- Open to:
 - ✓ Graduate Students
 - ✓ Master Students
 - ✓ Graduating Seniors
 - ✓ Graduating Masters
- Students in doctoral programs shall normally have finished their course work
- Students in masters or graduate professional programs shall have administrative approval to interrupt their course work
- The Fox Fellowship is **NOT** open to post doctoral applicants
- Preference will be given to the students who have never studied at Yale or in the US before

Application Process

- Application materials:
 - ✓ Application cover sheet
 - ✓ Research proposal, describing the topic and method of research, the facilities you will need (e.g. specific libraries, archives, institutes and/or scholars) and how the research fits your academic program and/or career plans, and the goal of the Fox International Fellowship Program. The proposal should address your career aspirations



Application Process 2

- ✓ Leadership Statement addressing your leadership potential (include information on any leadership roles you have undertaken) and commitment to being a “citizen ambassador”
 - ✓ Official TOEFL or IELTS scores
 - ✓ Two letters of recommendation from faculty members
 - ✓ Your curriculum vitae
 - ✓ Official transcript of your grades
